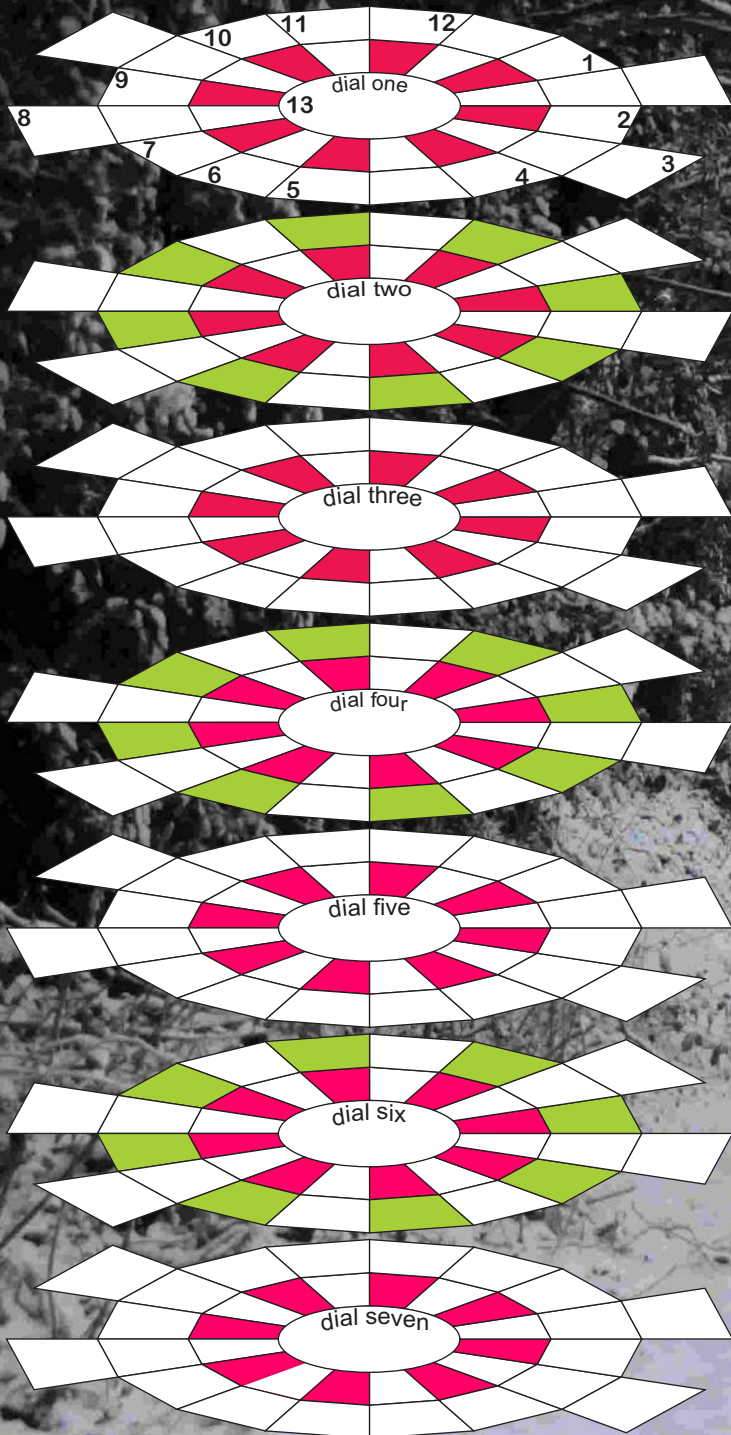


# December 2010 Sirius



This seasonal puzzle is a 3D Cryptex with seven spinning dials (D1, D2, D3 ...)

Odd dials have outer rings of circular (C) solutions of 16 letters. Clues for these have additional anagrams which start and finish anywhere in the rings. They 'spin'.

Each dial has 4 'diametric' (Di) solutions. These run from any point on the perimeter, through the centre to the other side. Down (d) solutions are conventional. Four of the down solutions are made of two separate words and these are clued separately.

All clues for dial one have full directions. Other clues have only their dial number.
