There are 8 down (D) solutions and one solution which runs up (U) the grid. Some down solutions are made up of two words. The clues for each unrelated word are separated by a colon.

When you have twiddled and fiddled the order of the dials and their orientation then at last all the down solutions work and the puzzle is solved.

It might be useful to look at the December 2010 puzzle and solution which was the first 3D Cryptex also presented as a partial jig-saw.
