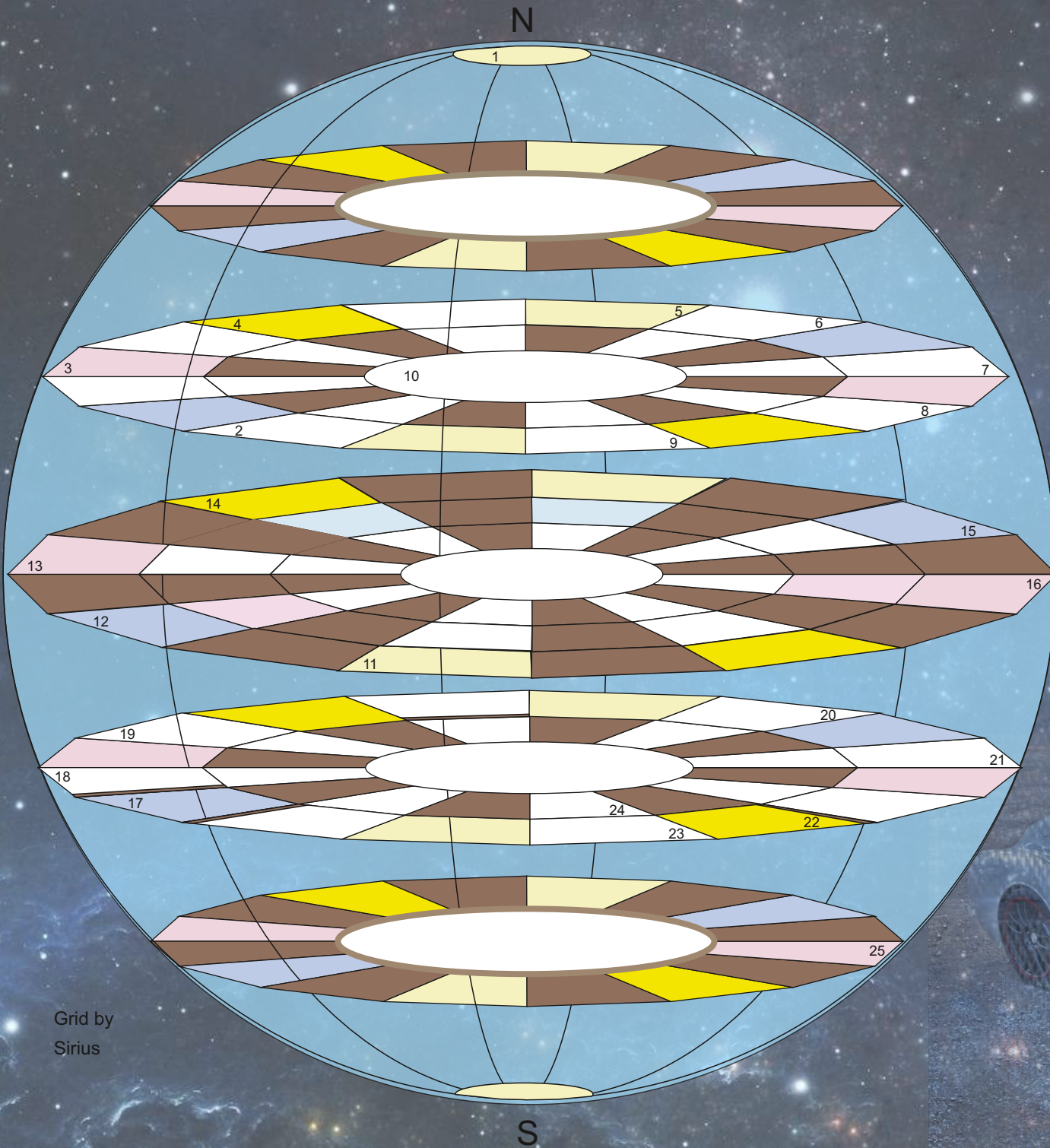

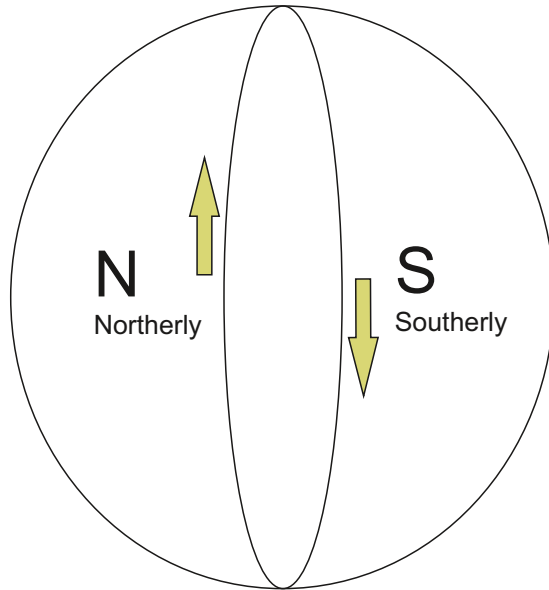

South Pole

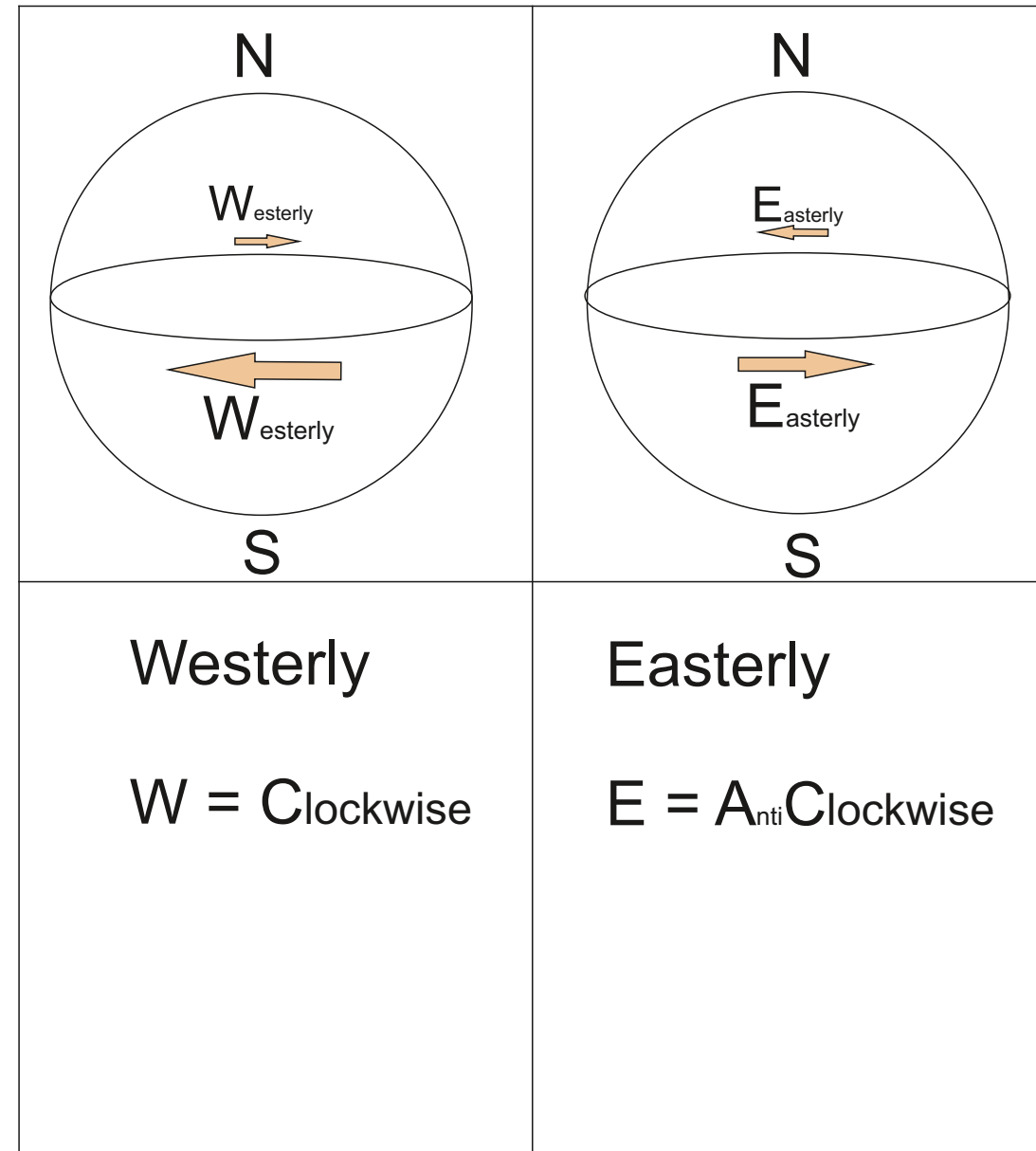
The first number in a crossword clue direction identifies the cell for the first letter of the solution. A cell on the surface of the sphere will lie on two circles, one of longitude and one of latitude.

N, S, E, and W are **directions** not places. They are used to give the **initial** direction for the solution to run and keep running. N means to run upwards initially towards the North Pole. S means to run down initially towards the South Pole. A solution that starts off running North can end running South because it is on a circle.

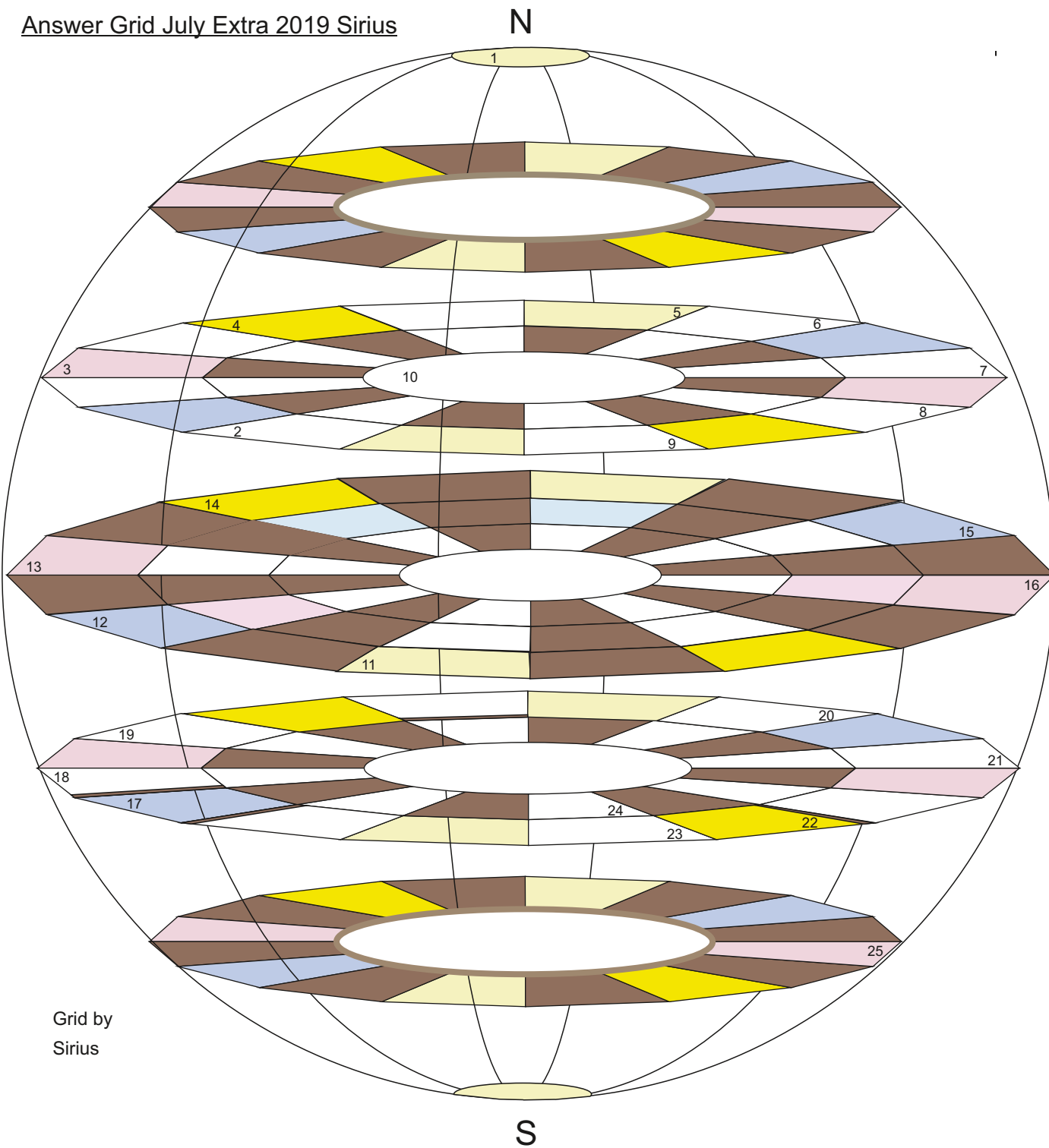
There are no East or West Poles. An observer facing North always sees East on the right (sunrise) and West on the left (sunset). This is true wherever the observer is on the surface and faces North. Eg a solution with direction W starts from the numbered cell and moves in a Westerly direction as in the diagrams.

Diametric (di) solutions run in the direction from one side of a circle of latitude through the centre to the other side of the circle of latitude.
