

Several cells are initially empty. Solvers must fill these, making real words, to show what was revealed. Hidden within the grid is the surname of the person who made this revelation as well as three places where it was found (each one geographically located within the other, having lengths of 5, 16 and 4). All five must be highlighted or included with the list of final entries. The entries around the perimeter of the bottom layer are entered anticlockwise (a-cl); down/up answers always stay within the perimeter cells.

Clues are presented in alphabetical order of their solutions.
