


April 2024 Tramp Calluna

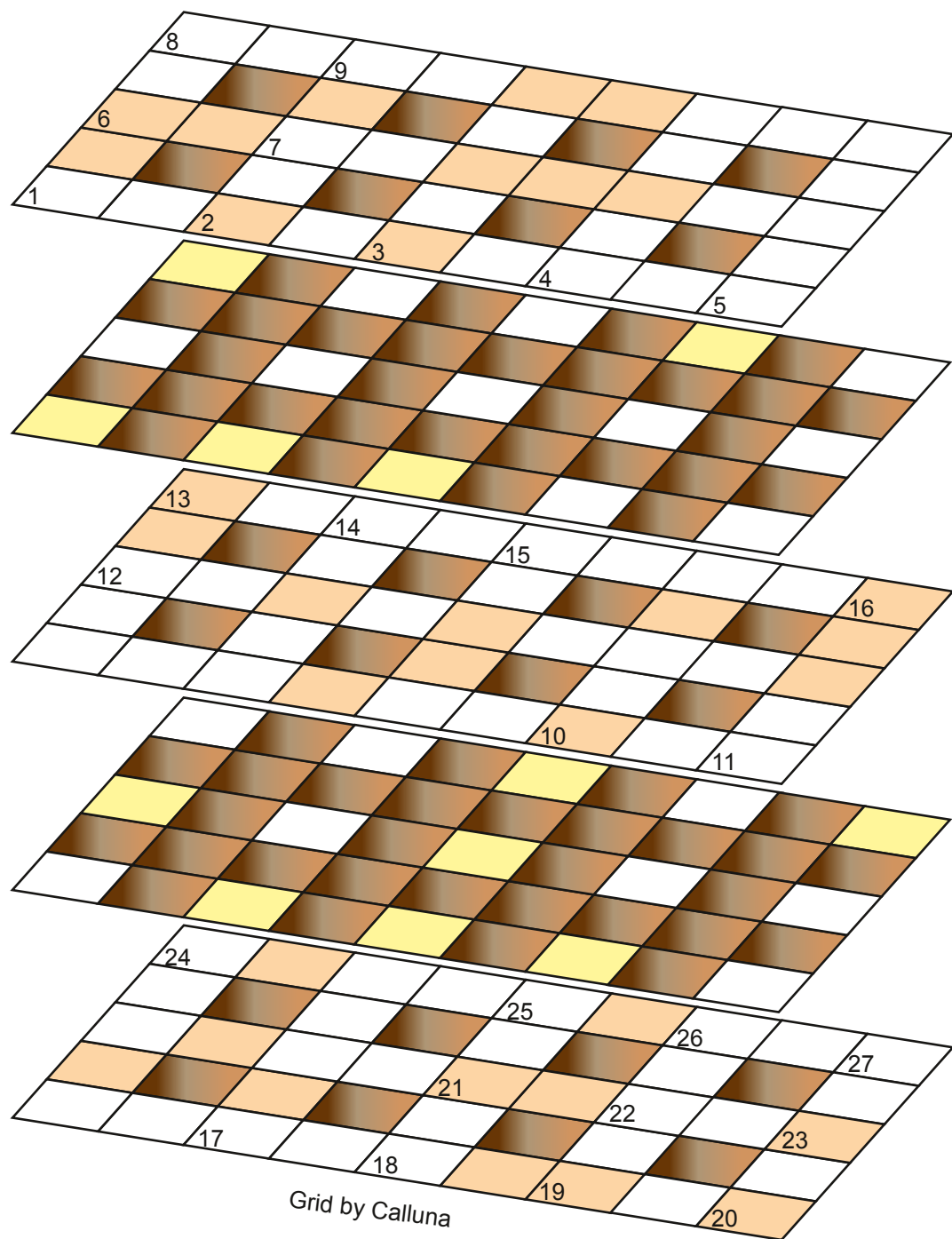
The puzzle marks the 100th anniversary of the birth of one represented in the grid in several guises.

Contents of the yellow cells can be rearranged to form the name which binds them together; the orange cells contain a jumble of perhaps the most well-known words uttered by the centenarian (2,5,4,3,2,5,2,4,6): these are to be included with the competition entry.
