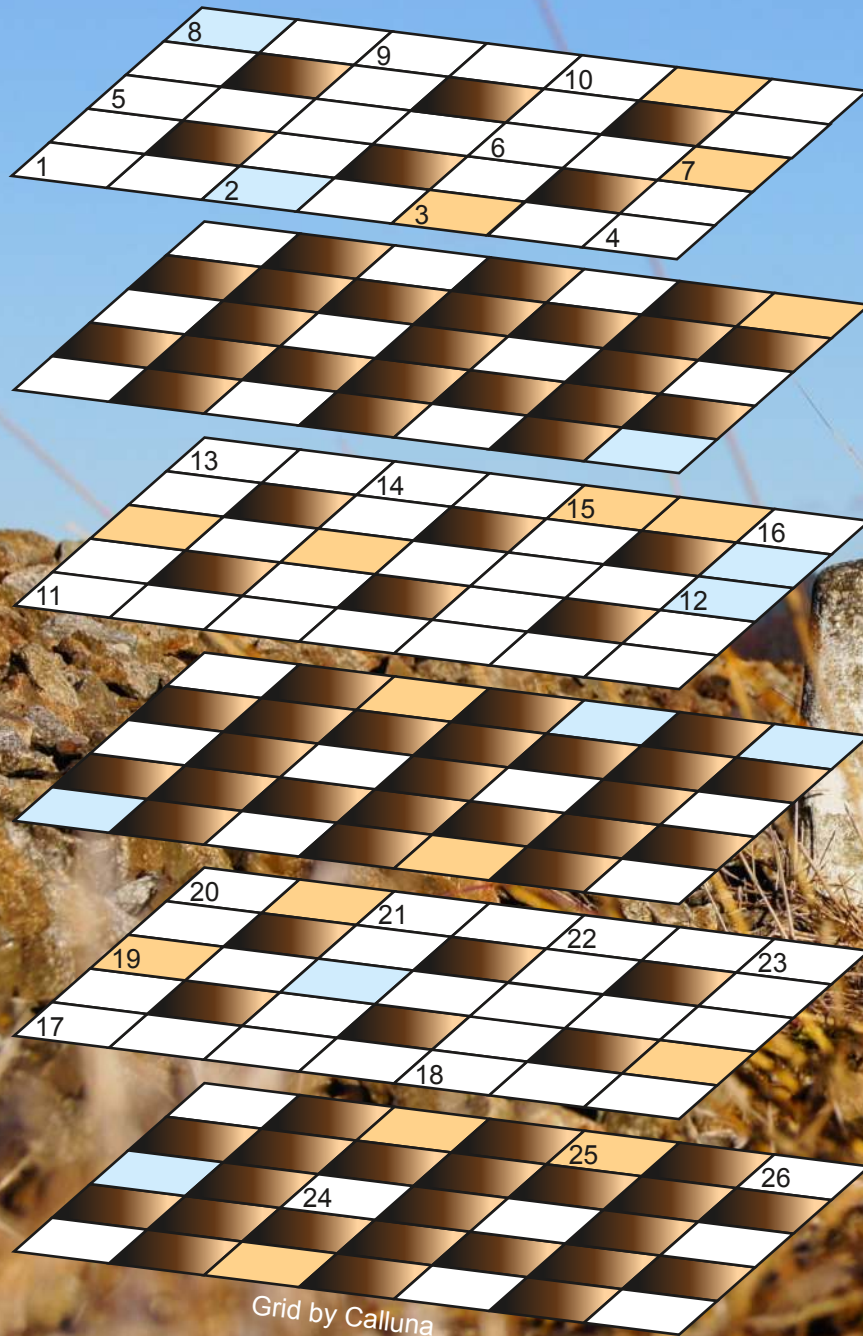

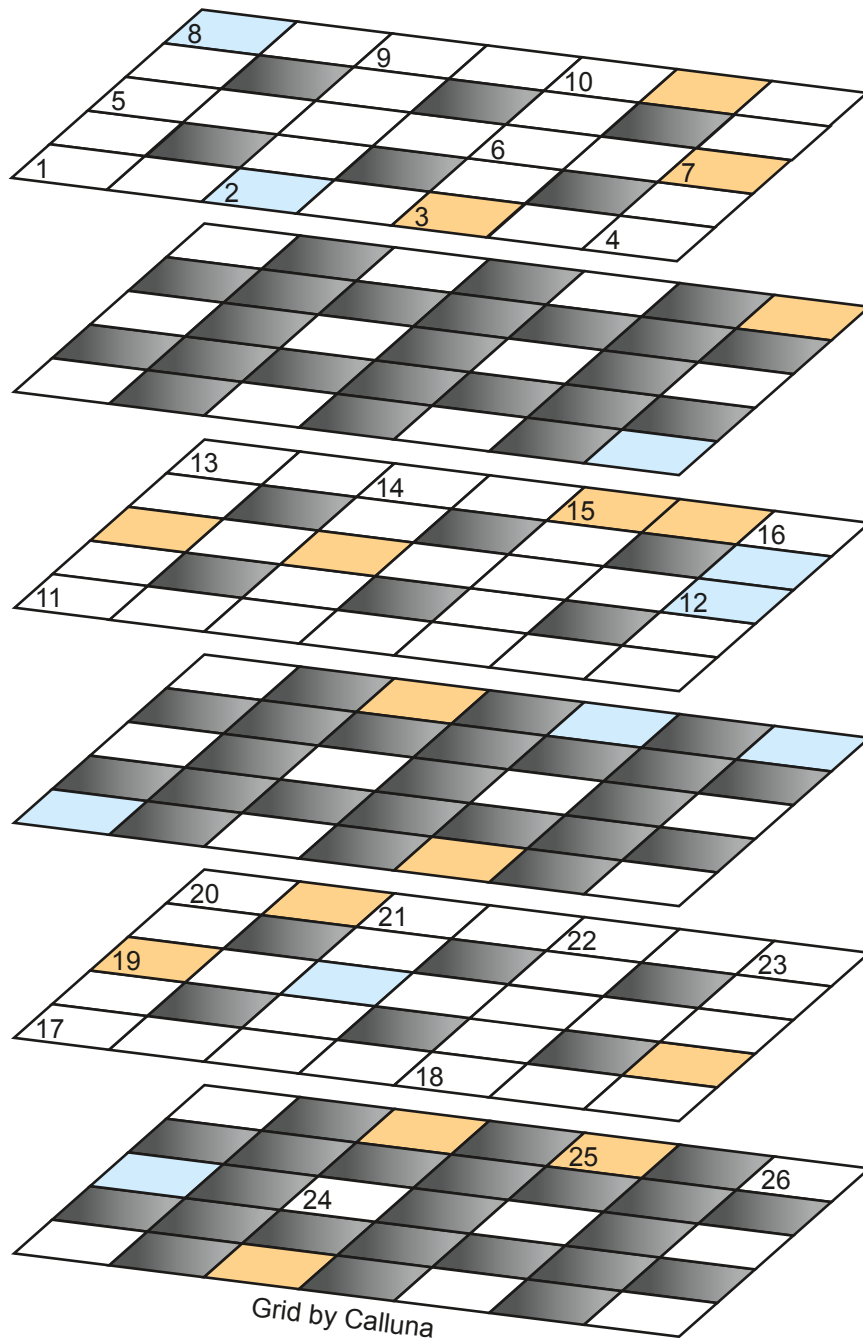


Grid by Calluna
